Alison Parks Weber is a professor of Spanish at the University of Virginia. Her scholarship focuses on Golden Age literature and Religious Discourse in Early Modern Spain. She has lectured and written widely in Spanish and English on Teresa of Avila, Mysticism, Women's Writings and many related topics.

Dr. Weber's books include *Approaches To Teaching Teresa of Avila and the Spanish Mystics* (ed. 2009), *For the Hour of Recreation by [Teresa's disciple] Maria de San Jose* (2002), and the groundbreaking study, *Teresa and the Rhetoric of Femininity* (1990). She has also written numerous scholarly essays related to Saint Teresa and the Spanish Carmelites. Among them are "The Fortunes of Ecstasy: Teresa of Avila and the Carmelite Reform" and "Spiritual Administration: Gender and Discernment in the Carmelite Reform."
