A leper[a] came to him begging him, and kneeling[b] he said to him, "If you choose, you can make me clean." Moved with pity,[c] Jesus[d] stretched out his hand and touched him, and said to him, "I do choose. Be made clean!" Immediately the leprosy[e] left him, and he was made clean. After sternly warning him he sent him away at once, saying to him, "See that you say nothing to anyone; but go, show yourself to the priest, and offer for your cleansing what Moses commanded, as a testimony to them." But he went out and began to proclaim it freely, and to spread the word, so that Jesus[f] could no longer go into a town openly, but stayed out in the country; and people came to him from every quarter.
